2021-2022 Scholarship Application

The Anne O'Hare McCormick Memorial Scholarship honors the legacy of Anne O'Hare McCormick of The New York Times, who in 1937 was the first woman to win the Pulitzer Prize for foreign correspondence. The McCormick Fund was created in 1954 as a posthumous tribute by McCormick's colleagues in the Newswomen's Club of New York.

The scholarship is awarded to female U.S. citizens who have been admitted to the Craig Newmark Graduate School of Journalism for study leading to a degree. Applicants must show evidence of both journalistic talent and financial need. All applications, clippings and broadcast work must be submitted in English. This scholarship is open to full-time and part-time students.

- (1) Why did you decide on a graduate journalism program and what are your expectations from this program?
- (2) What skills are you hoping to master?
- (3) What major story in the last five years has shaped your perspective—favorably or unfavorably—on journalism?
- (4) What drives you to be a journalist?
- (5) Given that journalism can be risky, can you pinpoint the moment when you chose this career?
- (6) Where do you see yourself in 10 years? How do you expect to make an impact as a journalist?

- **Two examples of published or broadcast work.**

(a) For newspaper, magazine, digital and photography clips, include links to online published/archived work and an attachment with copies of published work with your byline or credit line, date and place published.

(b) For broadcast students, include links to public or private YouTube channels or Vimeo so your work can easily be reviewed. Please include a brief description of the work, describe the role you played, the date it was produced, and a script.
